



# The 2018 Annual Report

## **Our 2018 Story in Short**

The year 2018 was a year of blessings for the Jesuit European Social Centre (JESC) and those we serve. After a year of transition in 2017, JESC grew in two respects in 2018: as a team and institution and as an apostolic mission with re-established objectives and areas of focus.

### **A Team and an Institution**

JESC grew as a team and as an institution. The team counted nine members as of the 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2018: three Jesuits working full time, an accountant and five trainees, three of whom are women. More interns are to join in early 2019. For team building we used a number of opportunities, spanning from professional coaching days and JESC internal lectures to birthday and Christmas celebrations as well as furniture assembling and windows cleaning. As of 2018, JESC established a small focused Administrative Council and General Assembly, both presided over by Franck Janin SJ, President of the Jesuit Conference of European Provincials (JCEP). As of 2018, there is a new Social apostolate steering committee for the JCEP. JESC adopted several organisational documents including the “JESC Charter,” “Safeguarding policies,” and a three-year “JESC re-energised” plan to implement the mission entrusted to us by the Provincials of Europe and the Near East. Financially, JESC performed well due to a solid treasury consolidated in the past years. A three-year budget plan was approved by our General Assembly and JESC continues to fundraise for its own projects and those of our closest partners.

## **Three Areas of Mission and Work**

JESC grew in its understanding of the work entrusted to it. We relied on a learning-by-doing discernment process. Three long-term objectives emerged: To build Europe, to promote justice & ecology, and to develop leadership. These mission areas take inspiration from the purpose of JESC, which is to "promote faith and justice" by providing "vision and values for Europe".

### **Building Europe**

During 2018, Martin Maier SJ, JESC Secretary for European Affairs, took part in several meetings on European matters which explored opportunities for future cooperation. To mention a few - meeting representatives of a European Affairs Consulting Group; participation in panels such as the Chapel for Europe's Christianity and Economic Inequality; organising workshops for public servants and political leaders. Martin continues to be the co-editor of the newsletter EuropeInfos, which JESC publishes together with COMECE.

Several team members, including all of our trainees, undertook missions to Strasbourg during the European Parliament's plenary weeks. We met with MEPs, press officials and other promising contacts for the future. One of our former JESC trainees became a leading member of the European Youth Parliament España.

During the year, JESC representatives attended conferences hosted by the EU institutions and by organisations in Brussels with a focus on the EU. They also played a part in the debates on the Union, in particular relating to the position of Christianity and religion. These include the EP's Dialogue Seminar on the European Pillar of Social Rights, and a seminar with president emeritus of the European Council, Herman Van Rompuy and Martin Maier at Notre-Dame d'Hurtebise.

### **Promoting Justice and Ecology**

JESC organised the Social Apostolate Delegates Meeting and the Social Centres Directors Annual Meeting in Milan, Italy, from April 8<sup>th</sup> to April 11<sup>th</sup>. On the agenda was a discussion of apostolic preferences and identity as well as a discussion by the European Jesuit Social Centres of their common vision and plans. The JESC Director attended the Annual Meeting of Directors of the Social Sector of the Spanish province on Ignatian spirituality for the social sector. He also visited the social apostolate sectors representatives of other provinces including Croatia, France, Hungary, Ireland and Portugal.

JESC supported the advocacy work on integral ecology of Jesuits and partners under the umbrella of EcoJesuit through the work of translation and launched "Eco-bites", our ecology newsletter. JESC took part in the 2018 Annual Ecojesuit Meeting, in Bogotá and Leticia, Colombia, on August 1<sup>st</sup>, to discuss cooperation and knowledge exchange between the organisations represented at the meeting of the Global Ignatian Advocacy Network (GIAN). On July 12<sup>th</sup>, JESC attended the "Environmental Sustainability Transitions" event organised by the European Parliamentary Research Service (EPRS). Finally, the JESC Eco-Team has joined the Ecological Cluster of the HEST programme (Higher Education for

Social Transformation). Together with staff members from a number of Jesuit educational institutes from around Europe and the Near East they are collaborating in a research project on food waste. Edmond Grace SJ became JESC Secretary for Justice and Ecology.

## **Developing Leadership**

JESC has been asked to develop leadership in a number of ways. One of those was the preparation of the European Leadership Programme (ELP). The aim of the ELP is to form future leaders practically and spiritually by helping ELP fellows learn about the European institutions through direct contact with politicians and decision makers while they study leadership issues and earn ECTS credits. In addition, an immersion programme will bring the future leaders in touch with marginalized people and those in need. Both the coaching programme and the experience of a supportive community will give the participants space for reflexion and personal growth.

Another highlight in 2018 was the Faith & Politics Workshop in Venice which was organised by a European Jesuit network. Edmond Grace, now on the JESC team, was one of the organisers. This year in Venice members of the JESC team met with young academics and prominent speakers in August 2018 who reflected on the life of faith in the context of current political issues in Europe. Besides that, the JESC Director offered silent spiritual retreats based on Scripture and the Constitutions of the Society of Jesus to managers and CEOs. Finally, JESC launched its own online newsletter on leadership called "The Leadership Post."

In my role as a Director and Social Apostolate Coordinator, I participated in events and delivered talks and presentations at a number of events such as the International Alumni Congress of priests and seminarians in Brussels. In the role of Social Apostolate Coordinator for the Conference, I conducted an extensive survey among the social delegates, organized the annual meeting of delegates, and began rebuilding the Social Centres network.

## Building Europe

Along with its partners JESC seeks to nurture the vision of Europe based on the Gospel. In this mission we make use of Christian social thinking and the orientations of the last general congregations of the Society of Jesus. We focus on the areas of poverty, human rights, ecology and climate change. Our fundamental reference point is Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'*. In June JESC participated in a discussion on this encyclical with 70 representatives of catholic institutions in Brussels, where special prominence was given to the establishment of a sustainable finance system in Europe. JESC also participated in several dialogue seminars organized by the European Parliament with churches, religious and philosophical organizations under Art. 17 (TFEU). JESC networks with and accompanies different groups who are reflecting on the future of the European Union.

One major event was the weekend session on “Rediscovering the European Common Good” co-organized with the group “Passion for Europe” from September 21st-23rd, at the spiritual centre “La Pairelle. The workshop brought together more than 60 participants from 17 different countries. The common reflections in panel discussions and groups were organized around the three axes of migration, ecology and cultural dialogue. This successful event will have a follow-up this September 13th-15th 2019 on “Europe and the long-term global challenges”.





With the Chapel for Europe, JESC organised a well-attended conference “Rediscovering the European Common Good” with some of Europe's major Church and political actors. This was a follow-up event on the September weekend, with the former president of the European Council Herman Van Rompuy as keynote speaker and Archbishop Jean-Claude Hollerich SJ, Rev. Christian Krieger and Marie de Saint-Chéron as major representatives of the Christian churches in Europe.

JESC and the Chapel for Europe organized a presentation of the book “Europe et Israël: Deux destins inaccomplis” on January 11<sup>th</sup>, followed by a debate between Rabbi David Meyer and Bernard Philippe (former official of the European External Action Service) on the topic of Europe and its role in Israel’s stability.

December marked the seventieth anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and to celebrate this event from an EU perspective First Vice President of the Parliament, Mairead McGuinness hosted a dialogue seminar which JESC attended. In Strasbourg the European Parliament held a conference in Strasbourg entitled “Europe and the Future of Human Rights” which was also attended by JESC.



## Partnership & Networks

JESC is closely connected with other European projects and networks including the following:

- **COMECE – The Catholic Church in the European Union,**

(*Commissio Episcopatum Communitatis Europensis*) is the representation of the European Bishops at the EU. Together with COMECE JESC publishes the newsletter EuropeInfos with Martin Maier as co-editor. Peter Rožič is a member of the External Relation Committee of COMECE.



- **IXE: Initiative of Christians for Europe,**

an initiative uniting numerous Catholic lay organizations representing the social teaching of Catholicism with the aim of placing it in the context of the EU.



- **CIDSE: Coopération Internationale pour le Développement et la Solidarité,**

an alliance of Catholic development agencies working together for global justice. CIDSE works in the areas of finance & development, food justice, climate justice, business and human rights and rethinking development.



- **UNIAPAC: International Christian Union of Business Executives,**

a network of Christian Business Leaders Associations from 38 countries in Europe, Latin America, Africa and Asia. UNIAPAC represents more than 30.000 active business executives around the world, working in various sectors of the world economy. An ecumenical organization, inspired by Christian Social Thought, its goal is to promote amongst business leaders the vision and the reality of an economy serving the human person and the Common Good of humanity at large. Martin Maier is UNIAPAC's spiritual adviser.

## Developing Leadership

“What does it need to be a good leader?” Pope Francis at a conference to mark the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Treaties of Rome gave the following response: “To be a Leader demands thoughtfulness, training and experience”. This appears to be contradictory to the widespread opinion, that successful leadership results from a certain kind of personality. Leaders, according to this view, are born, not made. Decisiveness and determination are the traditional traits of leaders but these qualities do not provide suitable answers of today’s political challenges.

The idea of launching a leadership programme to support the European Idea was developed by John Dardis SJ, who was president of the Jesuit Conference of European Provincials and Cardinal Reinhard Marx, the president of the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the EU. In 2017, this task was given to Peter Rožič SJ, the new director of JESC.

In order to provide “Vision and Values for Europe”, JESC launched the European Leadership Programme (ELP) to train an integral type of leader for shaping the future of the European Union. Participants of the ELP will be trained to gain knowledge about the European Union and will be provided with socio-political experiences in the EU institutions. Because leadership is not just a matter of knowledge, the ELP provides a broad set of possibilities for growth on the personal level. To become aware of vulnerable or marginalised members of our society, experiences of immersion are available. There is also an element of training in reflection so that knowledge and experience are used in an effective manner. Above all, an integration of knowledge and experience into one’s own inner life will give orientation and support in the sometimes-tough task of leadership. To address these challenges, ELP offers a personal coaching programme by professional spiritual guides. Participants of ELP will live together in communities. Hopefully, lifelong friendships will result from a shared experience of learning and living together.

In order to make the ELP happen, on April 17<sup>th</sup> 2018, a JESC delegation met the President of the Spanish Episcopal Conference Cardinal Blázquez. Visits were also made to the Bishops' Conferences of Germany, Ireland and Italy, while contacts were established with Croatian and Belgian Bishops. On October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018, a first ELP Planning Meeting took place. The concept of the ELP was shown to invited guests from partner organisations in order to discuss the state of ELP and get feedback. Among the participants were Johan Verstraeten, Michael Kuhn, Miro Haček,



Simona Kukovič, Valentina Gusić, Alain Deneef, Jorge Nuño Mayer, Diego Losada, Segart Barbara and Fr. Servaas Bosch.

A landmark in the development of the ELP was November 16<sup>th</sup>: the launch of the new homepage. A first start-up point for future applicants was created. Potential applicants have had, since then, the opportunity to get information on the ELP before the application period started on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. Over the year, the work on ELP continued successfully, so that on December 3<sup>rd</sup>, the application period opened. The first programme cycle will start in February 2019.



## Partnership & Networks

The section “Developing Leadership” of JESC has close links with the Venice Faith & Politics workshop which takes place every two years. In August 2018, this week-long session invited young adults from every part of Europe to explore how faith and politics are related. It drew on the story of Europe and the wisdom of the Spiritual Exercises and offered time for reflective conversation with other participants. The objective was to empower them to engage, as Europeans, in public service for the common good in a world of contradictions.





## Promoting Justice and Ecology

The call of *Laudato Si'* to “care for our common home” has given Christianity a shot in the arm. Furthermore, the 36<sup>th</sup> General Congregation (GC) of the Society of Jesus stresses the worldwide need for reconciliation. This is not limited to reconciliation among persons and societies but extends also on reconciliation between the human race and its environment. From a Christian perspective, these two documents point the way to a genuine Christian action for the preservation of nature. With its activities on the field of Justice & Ecology, JESC is following up on the issue raised by *Laudato Si'* and the decrees of the 36<sup>th</sup> General Congregation. The major task of this group is to support at European level the work of Ecojesuit, a platform that brings Jesuits and ecology into contact. To spread the ideals of *Laudato Si'* and the ideas of Ecojesuit, JESC has a monthly newsletter - Eco-Bites.



## Partnership & Networks

The Jesuit European Social Centre (JESC) and the Jesuit Conference Asia Pacific (JCAP) have combined to publish an online communication currently in Spanish, English, and French. '*EcoJesuit*' or *Ecology and Jesuits in Communication* offers commentaries, reflections, analysis, and exchange of practices on various ecological and social concerns. While it has a global reach, Ecojesuit communicates communities and local concerns. While initially directed at Jesuit practitioners and organizations working on ecological concerns, Ecojesuit encourages participation and communication beyond the Jesuits and promotes a global collaboration and networking on ecology. It is an invitation to Jesuits and their partners throughout the world to understand and share in the critical work of reconciliation and responding to ecological concerns (GC35 Decree 3).



Our Eco-Team has joined the ecology of the HEST programme (Higher Education for Social Transformation). Together with Jesuit educational institutes from around Europe and the Near East they collaborate in a research project on food waste.



Finally, JESC continues to collaborate closely with the Jesuit Conference of Africa and Madagascar (JCAM) through its JENA office (Jesuit Justice and Ecology Network Africa) together with Charlie Chilufya SJ, its director. JESC has been supportive of JENA's Tax Justice and other advocacy campaigns.
